Small groups don't rule the world: China

CHINA ON SUNDAY pointedly cautioned Group of Seven (G7) leaders that the days when "small" groups of countries decided the fate of the world was long gone, hitting back at the richest democracies as they sought to act in concert to counter Beijing's might.

"The days when global decisions were dictated by a small group of countries are long gone," a spokesman for the Chinese embassy in London said. "We always believe that countries, big or small, strong or weak, poor or rich, are equals, and that world affairs should be handled through consultation by all countries."

The Chinese spokesman said the only valid global system was the international order based on the principles of the UN and "not the so-called rules formulated by a small number of countries".

The G7, whose leaders are meeting in southwestern England, has been searching for a

US PRESIDENT JOE Biden brought a sharply different tone to the G7 summit from his predecessor Donald Trump, a source with knowledge of the discussions said.

"It used to be complete chaos," said the source. "Before, we were on edge the entire, the whole time just trying to keep the G7 intact — and you don't have to worry about that now... You can have a frank discussion without having to start it off by saying: 'No, Russia is not going to come back into the G7,'" the source said.

'Would accept conditional handover of cyber criminals to US'

PRESIDENT VLADIMIR PUTIN has said Russia would be ready to hand over cyber criminals to the United States if Washington did the same for Moscow and the two powers reached an agreement to that effect.

Putin made the comments in an interview aired in excerpts on state television on Sunday ahead of a June 16 summit with US President Joe Biden in Geneva.

Ties between the powers are badly strained over an array of issues. The Russian leader said he expected the Geneva meeting to

help establish bilateral dialogue and revive personal contacts, adding that important issues for the two men included strategic stability, Libya and Syria, and the environment.

Putin also praised Biden for having shown "professionalism"

when the United States and Russia agreed this year to extend the New START nuclear arms control treaty.

The White House has said Biden will bring up ransomware attacks emanating from Russia at the meeting. That issue is in the spotlight after a cyber attack disrupted the North American and Australian operations of meat-packer JBS USA.

A Russia-linked hacking group was behind that attack, a US source familiar with the matter said last week.

Asked if Russia would be prepared to find and prosecute cyber criminals, Putin said Russia's

behaviour here would depend on formal agreements being reached by Moscow and Washington. Both sides would have to commit to the same obligations, he said.

"If we agree to extradite criminals, then of course Russia will do that, we will do that, but only if the other side, in this case the United States, agrees to the same and will extradite the criminals in question to the Russian Federation," he said. "The question of cyber security is one of the most important at the moment because turning all kinds of systems off can lead to really difficult consequences," he said.

Macron, Johnson spar over Brexit geography

FRENCH PRESIDENT EMMANUEL Macron stepped into the Brexit maelstrom on the sidelines of the Group of Seven (G7) summit by sparring with British Prime Minister Boris Johnson over the post-Brexit geography of the United Kingdom and France.

Ever since the UK voted to leave the European Union in 2016, the two sides have been trying to solve the riddle of what to do about the UK's Northern Ireland which has a land border with EU member Ireland.

The latest spat comes after Britain's Telegraph newspaper reported that Macron had suggested during talks at the G7 with Johnson that Northern Ireland was not part of the UK

after the PM queried how he would react if French courts prevented the shipment of Toulouse sausages to Paris.

"The president said that Toulouse and Paris were part of a single geographic area and that Northern Ireland was on an island," the Elysee Palace said. "The president wants to highlight that the situation was quite different and that it wasn't right to draw this kind of comparison," the Elysee said.

British foreign minister Dominic Raab voiced his criticism of the EU, saying, "Various EU figures here in Carbis Bay, but frankly for months now and years, have characterised Northern Ireland as somehow a separate country and that is wrong. It is a failure to understand the facts," he told the BBC's Andrew Marr programme.
