Penile sexual assault between thighs of victim held together amounts to rape : Ker HC

The decision came in an appeal filed by a man against a trial court verdict in a matter that involved unfortunate instances of repeated sexual assault of various degrees on a minor girl by him, who is also her neighbour. The Kerala High Court has held that any manipulation of the body of a woman such as penetrative sexual act between the thighs of a victim to simulate a sensation akin to penetration of an orifice is rape. The decision came in an appeal filed by a man against a trial court verdict in a matter that involved unfortunate instances of repeated sexual assault of various degrees on a minor girl by him, who is also her neighbour. "...when the body of the victim is manipulated to hold the legs together for the purpose of simulating a sensation akin to penetration of an orifice, the offence of rape is attracted. When penetration is thus made in between the thighs so held together, it would certainly amount to 'rape' as defined under Section 375," ruled a bench of Justices K Vinod Chandran and Ziyad Rahman on Monday.



The court said that when penetration is thus made in between the thighs so held together, it would certainly amount to 'rape' as defined under Section 375. "In short, considering the intention of the legislature as revealed from the above proposals, followed by the enactment of Criminal Law Amendment Act, 1913 and gradual evolution of the concept of the offence of 'rape' from time to time, the irresistible conclusion is that, the definition of rape as contained in section 375 would take in, all forms of penetrative sexual assault onto vagina, urethra, anus or any other parts of the body so manipulated to get the feeling or sensation of an orifice," the court said. The court said this while deciding whether

the penetration to "any part of the body of such woman" as mentioned in section 375(c) of the Indian Penal Code like sexual assaults beyond penile penetration into vagina, urethra, anus and mouth; the known orifices in the human body to which such penetration is imaginably possible is rape. "We have already found that, Section 375 as amended by Act 13 of 2013, widened the definition of 'rape' by expanding its ambit beyond the penile penetrative assault into vagina. One of the consequences of such amendment is that, several penetrative sexual assaults, which would otherwise

be triable under Section 377, now come within the operative field of Section 375," the court said. However, Section 377 would still be attracted in cases of penetrative sexual assaults against the order of nature, which are not falling under Section 375, the court said. In its order, the court said it is established from the evidence that, the appellant had committed the offence of rape as he had penetrative sexual act between the thighs of the victim held together; an act of manipulation of the body of the victim to obtain sexual gratification, which culminated in penetration. Partly allowing the appeal, the court said as the prosecution failed to provide any evidence to prove the age of the victim, the offences under the provisions of the POCSO Act and also under section 376(2)(i) of the Indian Penal Code are not attracted. "However the sexual acts committed by the appellant is sufficient to attract the offence of section 375(c) read with section 376(1) of IPC," the court said. As he is found guilty of offence under Section 376(1) read with Section 375(c) instead of Section 376(2)(i) and 377 by the Sessions Court, the sentence of life imprisonment with the meaning of imprisonment of remainder of natural life.

India not invited to 'extended Troika' meeting on Afghanistan convened by Russia

As the Taliban continues its offensive in Afghanistan, Russia has stepped up efforts to reach out to all key stakeholders in the war-torn country to stop the violence and push the Afghan peace process. India has not been invited to a crucial meeting being convened by Russia on the fast-evolving situation in Afghanistan that is expected to see the participation of Pakistan, China and the US, people familiar with the development said on Thursday. As the Taliban continues its offensive in Afghanistan, Russia has stepped up efforts to reach out to all key stakeholders in the war-torn country to stop the violence and push the Afghan peace process. The 'extended Troika' meeting is scheduled to be held in Qatar on August 11. Talks under the format had earlier taken place on March 18 and April 30. Russia has also been holding the 'Moscow Format' of talks to bring peace and creating conditions for the process of national reconciliation in Afghanistan. Last month, Russian Foreign Minister Sergey Lavrov said in Tashkent that Russia will continue to work with India and other countries which can influence the situation in Afghanistan.

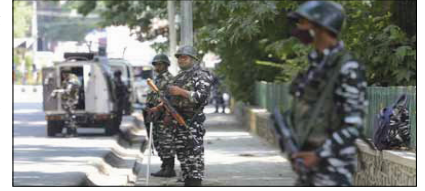
Following the comments, there was speculation that India may be included in the upcoming 'extended Troika' meeting. "We will continue working with the Americans in the extended Troika format as well as with all other countries that can influence the situation in Afghanistan, including our partners from Central Asia, India, Iran and the US," he had told reporters. "We have a Moscow format that includes all the main players," Lavrov had said. Though Russia has differences with the US on various dimensions of the Afghan conflict, both countries are now pushing for the intra-Afghan talks and to put an end to the widespread violence being perpetrated by the Taliban. India is yet to comment on the upcoming

extended Troika meeting. Meanwhile, Afghan Ambassador to India Farid Mamundzay described as a positive development the decision to hold a meeting of the United Nations Security Council on August 6 to discuss the situation in Afghanistan. India's ambassador to the UN TS Tirumurti announced that the UN Security Council will meet on Friday under Indian Presidency to discuss and take stock of the situation in Afghanistan. "Convening an emergency UN Security Council Session on Afghanistan is a positive development. UN & international community must play a greater role to stop the unfolding tragedy in Afghanistan due to violence & atrocities by terrorists. Thank you India for the leadership as UNSC President," Mamundzay tweeted. The decision to hold the UNSC meeting came two days after Afghan Foreign Minister Mohammed Hanif Atmar spoke to his Indian counterpart S Jaishankar on the convening of an emergency session of the UN Security Council to stop Taliban's violence. India holds the presidency of the UNSC for the month of August. The Taliban has been making rapid advances across Afghanistan by resorting to widespread violence since the United States began withdrawing its troops from the country on May 1. The US has already pulled back the majority of its forces and is looking to complete the drawdown by August 31. India has been a major stakeholder in the peace and stability of Afghanistan. It has already invested nearly USD 3 billion in aid and reconstruction activities in the war-ravaged country. India has been supporting a national peace and reconciliation process that is Afghan-led, Afghan-owned and Afghan-controlled. It has also been calling upon all sections of the political spectrum in Afghanistan to work together to meet the aspirations of all people in the country, including those from the minority communities, for a prosperous and safe future.

Two years of abrogation of Article 370 : Situation peaceful, say officials

In a virtual interaction on Thursday, Prime Minister Narendra Modi stated that August 5 will be "remembered in history" as two years ago on this day, Article 370 was abrogated, while the "first step was taken towards the construction of the Ram Temple in Ayodhya" in 2020. The official Twitter account of PM Modi's personal website, also stated that there has been "unprecedented peace & progress in the region" since the abrogation. PDP president and former J&K chief minister Mehbooba Mufti, who was placed under house arrest in 2019 shortly before the announcement of the bifurcation of the state into Union territories, termed the move "gross injustice".

While words or pictures are enough to depict the pain, torment & upheaval inflicted upon J&K on this black day two years ago. When unbridled oppression is unleashed & gross injustice heaped there is no other choice but to resist to exist," Mufti said in a tweet on Thursday. Echoing her sentiments, Khurshid Alam of the Jammu and Kashmir People's Conference said, "August 5 will always be a negative milestone in the history of J&K. It was a political and psychological setback for the people of J&K." The Gupkar alliance, which has pushed for the restoration of the special status conferred upon the state, held talks over the second anniversary at the residence of chairman and National Conference president Farooq Abdullah's residence in Srinagar. It was attended by Mufti, M Y Tarigami, spokesperson and CPI(M) leader, and Muzaffar Shah, senior vice-president of the Awami National Conference. On Wednesday, the Peoples Alliance for Gupkar Declaration (PAGD), in a statement, said that J&K remains "as far from Delhi and J [heard] of India as it has ever been". Raising concerns over jobs and land rights of the people of J&K, the PAGD termed the slogan of "Naya Kashmir" a joke. Tarigami said the recent all-party meet chaired by PM Modi had triggered hopes in J&K but nothing concrete was done to restore the confidence of the people. NC leader Omar Abdullah, another leader who was put under house arrest, on Wednesday recalled that he was "deeply jaded and disappointed" over the central government's announcement two years back. "There is so much talk about the restoration of Article 370. We would welcome that if it really happened. The administration needs to go beyond inaugurating projects, which work had begun during the time of elected governments," the NC leader said, adding that the full statehood should be restored for J&K followed by Assembly elections. Whereas, the Apni Party chief had on Tuesday vowed to launch a peaceful struggle for the restoration of Article 370 of the Constitution if the apex court did not restore it. The Hurriyat Conference on Thursday stated that the actions of the government on August 5, 2019, "complicated the dispute further over the state of J&K," as it "ignited the flames along the Line of Actual Control (LAC)." It expressed resentment over the "unilateral and arbitrary actions" related to Articles 370 and 35-A, and urged the government to hold meaningful talks with all stakeholders. The Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) in Jammu and Kashmir in a statement on Wednesday said the Centre was working to ensure honourable resettlement of Kashmiri Pandits in the Valley. "Modi government is committed to ensure return of Kashmiri Pandits to their roots and understands that they may be upset of Kashmir because of compulsion but the year to go back to the valley. The government is working on ways for the honourable resettlement of the community in the valley as per their wishes," BJP spokesperson Girdhari Lal Raina was quoted as saying. Earlier, during an online interaction, Union Minister Meenakshi Lekhi had suggested that Kashmiri Pandits were to blame for their failure to return to the Valley. However, Rana clarified, "Individual opinions expressed here and there do not reflect change in the official position of the party." Meanwhile, isolated incidents of violence were also reported from parts of J&K on Thursday. Militants attacked a police party in the Sopore area of the Baramulla district and an explosion, suspected to be an Improvised Explosive Device (IED), took place near the Jamia Masjid in Nowhatta area of Srinagar. No loss of life or injury were reported in either of the incidents, which are under investigation.
